It Has Surpassed Its Serviceability

Like other pieces of machinery, water heaters have a certain lifespan, with some reaching it earlier than others. For instance, it's been at least a year since you last cleansed or drained your water heater. It's the greatest way to predict when to replace a water heater because they only last six, nine, or twelve years on average. It's time to replace your water heater if it has outlived its usable life for any reason.



Rusted, Sandy, and Murky Water

Another indication that your water heater is getting old is if the water is discolored. This does not imply that your water heater has to be replaced because there could be a number of causes for this. Rust buildup from corrosion results in leaks in the water supply, which eventually causes colored water to come out of the faucets. But before you point the finger to your water heater, try running some cold tap water for a few minutes. Your pipes, not the heater, are probably to blame if the water is rusty. If it isn't, you might have to install a new water heater.



Your Electric Bills Are Exorbitant

If you have exorbitant energy costs, your water heater definitely isn't operating properly, necessitating the purchase of an energy-efficient water heater. If your model is energy efficient, however, it may require expert maintenance.
