
## **How To Make A Wood Flower Planter Box**


With the right plans, materials, and equipment, you can build this Simple Flower Planter Box, as shown here.





## **Materials**

- 1" x 10" x 10' Material of Choice (Cedar Recommended): One Piece
- 1" x 8" x 48" Material of Choice (Cedar Recommended): One Piece
- Flower Box Liner Material (Optional): 6 mil poly, copper, etc.
- 2" Wood Screws; 1/4 lb.
- Sandpaper
- Wood Filler and Glue
- Exterior Polyurethane Poly









Step 1: Cut the Pieces - Determine the desired size of the Flower Box

- Select the 1" x 10" x 10' Material: Crosscut the Front, Back, and Side Panels per the dimensions above
- Select the Front and Back Panel: Using a Band Saw, cut the Panels to the dimensions above; countersink three holes at each right and left edge of each Panel
- Select the Side Panels: Using a Band Saw, cut the Panels to the design dimensions above
- Select 1" x 8" x 48" Material: Counter sink holes on the Front, Back, and Side edges
- Sand all Pieces



Step 2: Assemble the Pieces - Select the Flower Box Pieces

- Select the Front, Back, and Side Pieces; Using 2" screws, connect the pieces, as shown above
- Select the Bottom Panel; Using 2" screws, connect the Bottom to the completed assembly
- Drill some 1/4" Drain Holes in the Bottom Panel for drainage



Step 3: Finish the Flower Box - Select the Finishing Materials

- Use Exterior Wood Filler for all holes
- Complete all finish sanding
- Apply a minimum of three coats of Exterior Poly
