








American Landmarks: The Statue of Liberty


This monumental, standing 305 ft. tall, was given to the United States by France to show friendship between the two countries started during the Revolutionary War.

The word Pennsylvania is mispelled on the bell.



Located in the Black Hills of South Dakota, Mount Rushmore shows the faces of four United States presidents. Each president's nose is about 20 feet tall!


Betsy Ross

Bald Eagle

The bald eagle was chosen as the emblem of the United States in 1782 because of its long life, strength and majestic appearance. Above all, the eagle represents freedom. The eagle appears on many important documents and many gold and silver coins.

















The American Flag

The American flag is a symbol for unity and liberty. Many older versions of the flag had words like "hope" & "liberty" on them. In 1818 the flag with 13 stripes and stars for each state was created. The red stands for hardiness and valor, white symbolizes purity and innocence, while blue is the symbol for vigilance, perseverance and justice.



What do those words mean?





Hardiness - Being hardy means being strong or tough.

Justice - Justice has to do with fairness and the laws or rules.

Perseverance - To persevere means you keep going, stick with it and work hard!

Pure - To be pure can mean to be honest and true.

Valor - Having valor means having bravery or courage.

Vigilance - To be vigilant means to be aware or to pay attention.


