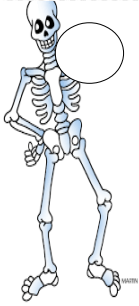

Halloween is celebrated on October 31st. It is an exciting day in the USA and in Great Britain.

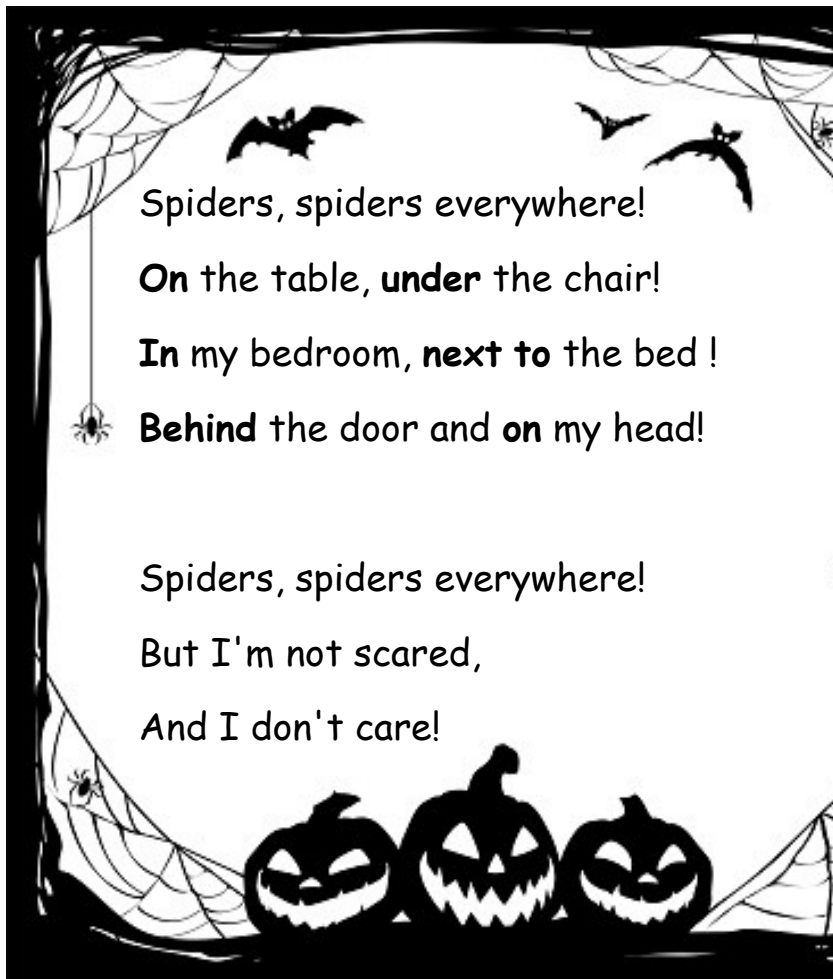
At Halloween American children in elementary schools take their costumes and masks to school.
