

Tex Avery compares the wolf to Hitler **in order to** make fun of him.






Blitz Wolf is a parody of *The Three Little Pigs*.




"Once upon a time" means "il était une fois"

The two little pigs are not scared because they signed a treaty.


Colossal stinker signed the treaty. It is funny because it is Adolf's nickname and it refers to an animal.
